Later the Private Stand became a Club with a membership fee – but even if the fee was not beyond the reach of those who aspired to be part of the Goodwood elite, prospective Members still had to secure the approval of current Members and the Duke of Richmond himself.

The five-day Festival Meeting, or ‘Glorious Goodwood’ as it is affectionately known, has become a clear highlight of the British summer scene as well as the racing calendar. The great and good of the land, often including members of the British Royal Family, traditionally came to Goodwood as a matter of course, prior to a week’s yachting at Cowes. Today Ascot, Wimbledon and Henley precede ‘Glorious Goodwood’ in what is an extensive and exciting summer sporting Season.

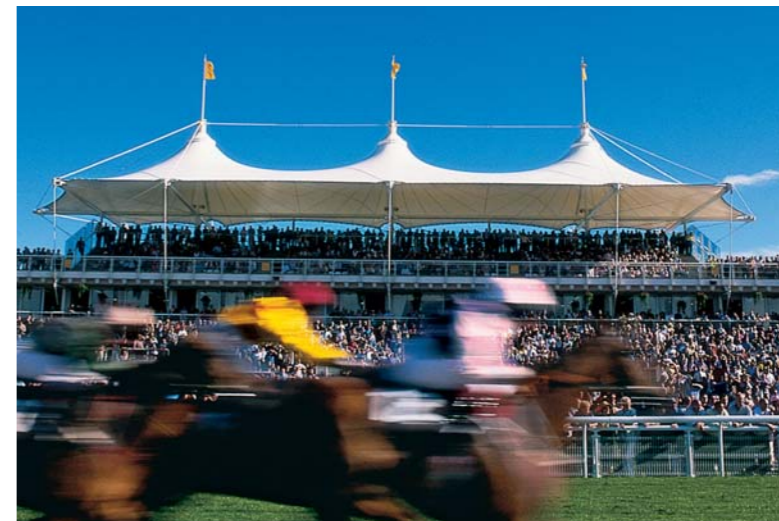

In 2001, we unveiled our multi-million pound development at the five-day Festival Meeting. The response from Members, racegoers, owners and trainers was overwhelmingly positive and the new views from the March Stand, down to the sea and the Isle of Wight, perfectly capture the essence of Goodwood – first-class sporting action in an area of outstanding natural beauty.

For the social racegoer, the Double Trigger Restaurant offers cool, sophisticated surroundings in which to take lunch or dinner. Its rooftop bar became a bustling meeting place during the Festival week for those who like to soak up the atmosphere of a summer day on the Sussex Downs.

The future is no less exciting. With 22 race days for the 2007 racing season, Goodwood promises to deliver first class racing in the most breathtaking of settings. The five-day Festival Meeting from late July through to August for 2007, will undoubtedly be the highlight, but the supreme standard that Goodwood produces consistently throughout the season, makes any race day a truly fantastic experience. The season gets underway in May with some of the most competitive early action in the country and runs through until the autumn with two October fixtures, offering the perfect way to round off an exceptional season.

THE KENNELS

Members will have access to The Kennels, a beautifully restored Grade 1 listed Georgian building, which is the clubhouse for all the Goodwood sports and your home from home while on the Estate.

OAK TREE CLUB (FESTIVAL MEETING)

The Oak Tree Club is located close to the Parade Ring in the Richmond Enclosure. Available to Members and their guests, the Oak Tree Club is a non-smoking facility offering a marvellous Parade Ring viewing position with comfortable seating,

a Champagne, Pimm's and Wine bar and simple but appetising delicatessen food. In addition, patrons will be able to watch racing on large screen televisions and bet with the Tote. A celebrity tipster will preview the afternoon's racing at 1pm every day and remain on hand throughout the afternoon. Racing papers and complimentary racecards will be available to all patrons. The Oak Tree Club Patrons' badge costs £35 per person per day or £130 for all five days. Sales are limited and badges will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Please note the cost of the patrons' badge is in addition to the cost of membership and/or members' guest day badges.

THE RACING COLOURS SHOP

Just across the horsewalk beside the Double Trigger Restaurant, you'll find the Racing Colours™ Shop which features gentlemen's and ladies' gifts and accessories exclusive to Goodwood visitors. BADGES

MEMBERS' ANNUAL BADGES

Members receive a lapel badge for the season which gives them entry to the Richmond Enclosure for all meetings, including the Festival Meeting, affectionately known as 'Glorious Goodwood'. Badge holders are issued with Admission Vouchers for each day of the Festival Meeting and these must be handed in when entering the Racecourse. The voucher scheme enables us to monitor the number of racegoers entering the Richmond Enclosure as required by the British Horseracing Board and Safety at Sports Grounds legislation.

GUEST ANNUAL BADGES

Members are also able to buy individual guest badges for one adult and for juniors, which give entry into the Richmond Enclosure throughout the year.

Adult Guest £225. *Junior (5-25 years)* £95.

DAILY BADGES FESTIVAL MEETING

In addition, Members can purchase up to six daily badges, for personal guests, for any raceday during the Festival Meeting. These daily badges are restricted to Members, and it is likely that the badges will be sold out in advance of the meeting, so please book early. Children under 5 are **not** admitted to the Richmond Enclosure at the Festival Meeting.

Adult Guest £57 per day (before 1.7.07 - £52 per day).

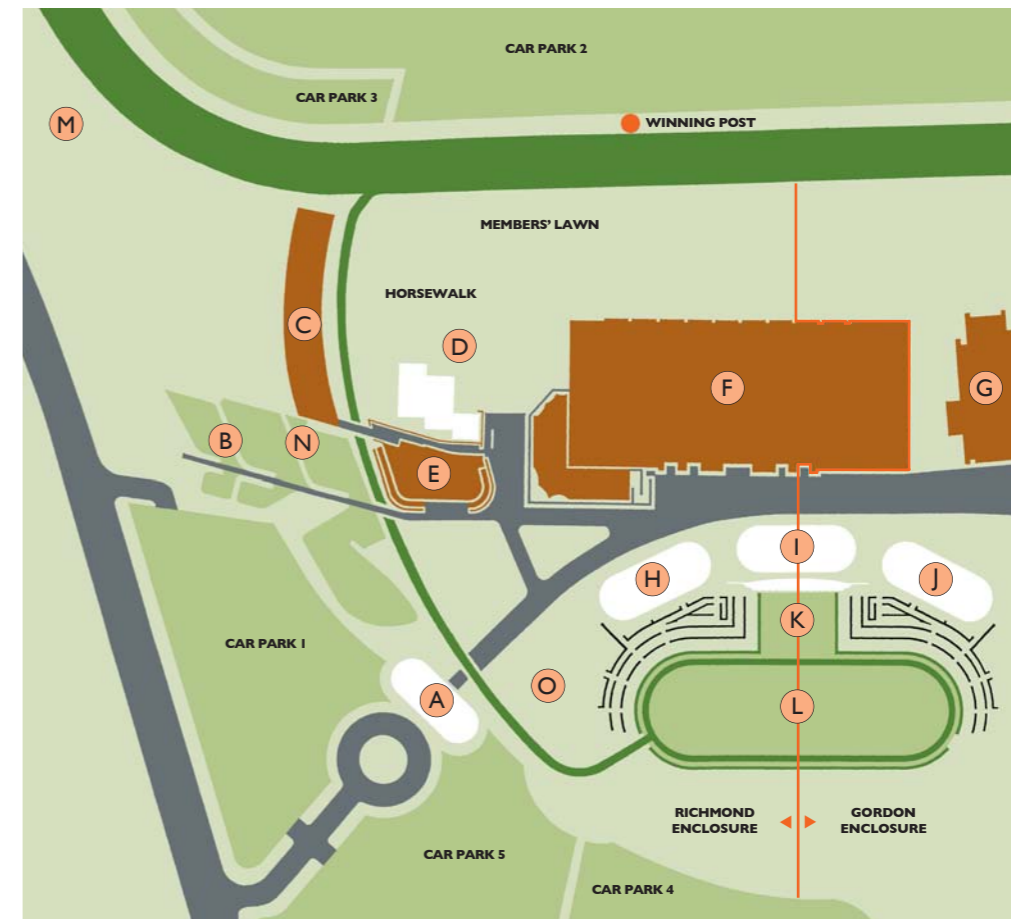
Junior (5 - 25 years) £19 per day.

CAR PARKING

No. 2 Car Park:

- Annual label valid at all meetings - £62.
- Annual label giving reserved and numbered berth for the Festival Meeting and a parking space at all other meetings - £265. Closing date for bookings 1 April.
- Annual label valid at Non-Festival Meetings only - £35.

At Non-Festival Meetings all the above labels admit to car parks 2,3 & 8. NB: Entry to No. 3 car park after 1 hour before the first race, if space permits.

Early booking is recommended, as these labels sell out well in advance of the start of the season. One per Member subject to availability. Cars only. Dogs are not allowed.

Daily labels for Non Festival Meetings are only available in advance, £4.

No. 3 Car Park: (max.66). Berths only. First refusal being given to previous year's berth holders, applying before 28 February, then offered to the waiting list. Reserved and numbered berths for the Festival Meeting and priority for this car park (not numbered berth) up until 1 hour before the first race at other meetings. Label also admits to car parks 2 & 8 at the other meetings. Cars only. Dogs are not allowed. £600.

No. 5 Car Park: Annual label giving reserved and numbered berth for the Festival Meeting and a parking space (not numbered berth) at all other meetings in car parks 2,3,5 & 8. Cars only. £205. Closing date for bookings 1 July. Entry to No. 3 car park after 1 hour before the first race, if space permits.

No. 5 Car Park - Non Festival Meetings:

Suitable for West Entrance. Cars only. Parked in order of arrival. Per day, at entrance or in advance, £4. (No. 5 Annual Car Labels admit).

No. 8 Car Park:

Suitable for East Entrance. Cars only. Parked in order of arrival. Per day, at entrance or in advance, £7 Festival Meeting £4 Non Festival Meetings (All Annual Car Labels admit).

No. 10 Car Park:

3 Furlong Picnic Park overlooking the Racecourse. Right on the rails at the 3f point, this car park makes an ideal picnic spot. Admission to the Lennox Enclosure for up to four occupants is included.

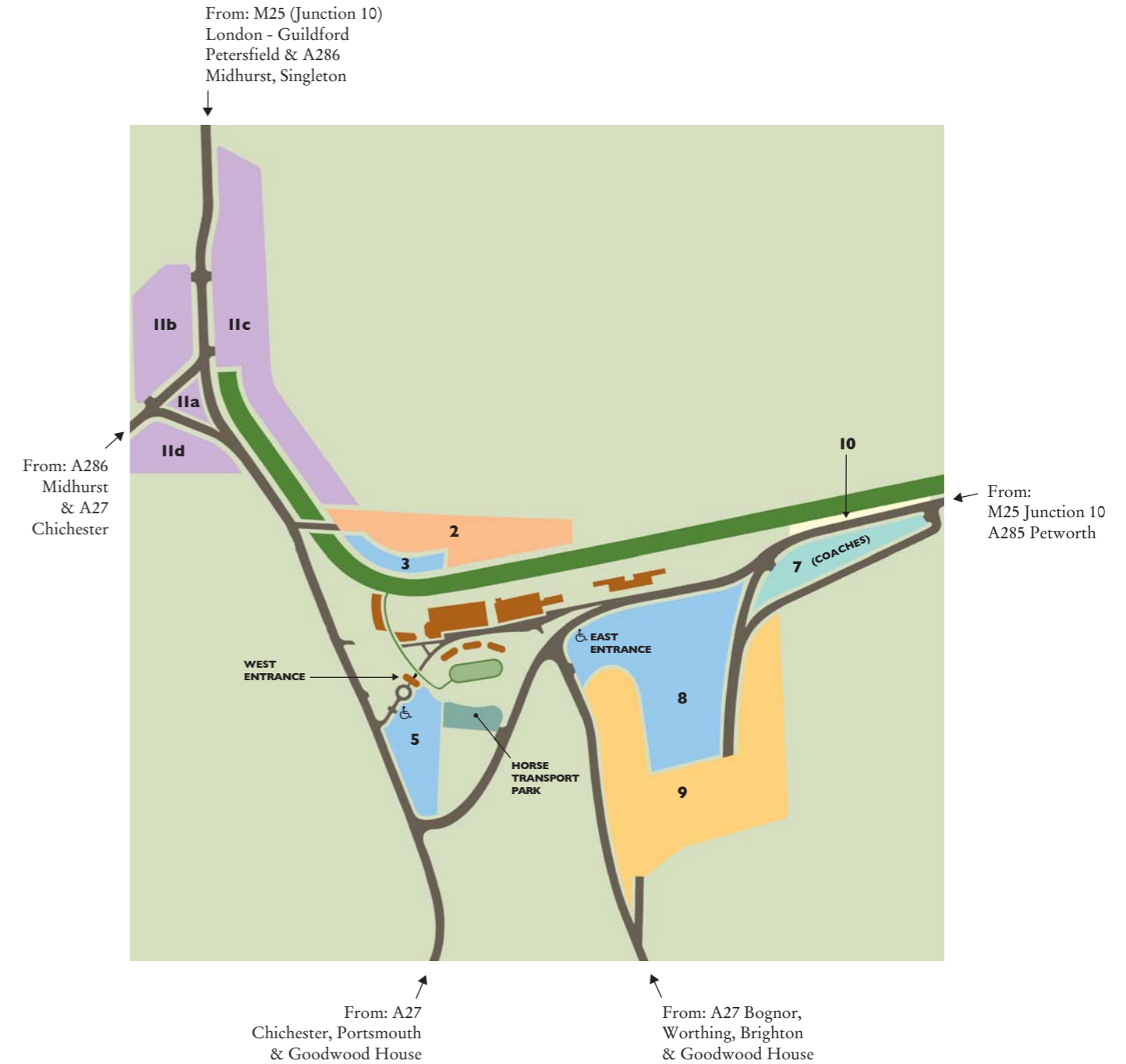

Bookings for all restaurants can be made with Payne & Gunter on 01243 775350 from the 2 January. Bookings can only be confirmed on receipt of full payment. Provisional bookings will only be held for 14 days from the date of booking and will not be guaranteed until the payment is received.

Payment methods accepted prior to arriving at the Racecourse are: Visa, Mastercard, American Express, personal/company cheque. On the day, we accept all of the above, except company cheques.

In the event of a reduction of numbers, or cancellations, a full refund will only be given if a **minimum of 7 days' notice** is given **prior** to the race meeting.

Please note: Richmond Enclosure badges are required for entry to the above areas

RICHMOND ENCLOSURE REGULATIONS

1. No Member or guest in the Richmond Enclosure shall act as a bookmaker, or accept on behalf of, or as an agent for any bookmaker.
2. Jeans and shorts are not permitted. Gentlemen are required to wear jackets and either ties, polo-neck sweaters or cravats.
3. Any Member declared bankrupt or a defaulter on the turf, or who fails to pay the subscription by the final date of payment, or is guilty of conduct unbecoming to a Member, or acts contrary to the regulations, shall immediately cease to be a Member.
4. Members shall be held responsible for the conduct and fitness of any guest introduced by them.
5. Children under the age of 5 years are not admitted to the Richmond Enclosure at the Festival Meeting.
6. Goodwood Racecourse Limited does not accept responsibility for non-delivery of badges despatched or for postal delays.
7. A charge will be made if a Member loses a badge and wishes to be issued with a substitute.
8. Refunds will not be made in respect of unused badges returned.
9. Goodwood Racecourse Limited reserves the right to alter or add to these regulations at any time without giving notice.

GETTING TO GOODWOOD



Goodwood is situated just outside Chichester, only 60 miles from London, 30 miles from Brighton and Southampton.

BY ROAD

From London take the A3. At the Milford roundabout take the A286 via Haslemere and Midhurst. Before Chichester after passing through Singleton village take the next left, following the brown tourist board signs for the racecourse. Goodwood is situated at the top of the Downs. From Southampton & Brighton take the A27 to Chichester. On the Chichester ring road you will be able to follow the brown tourist signs towards the Motor Circuit, Goodwood House and the Racecourse which is situated at the top of the hill.

BY RAIL

Regular services to and from London Victoria (1hr 40mins) to Chichester plus the coastal service east to Brighton and west to Portsmouth make rail travel to Goodwood an attractive alternative to the car. (A coach service is provided on racedays between Chichester train station and the racecourse).

BY AIR

Goodwood has its own Aerodrome just two miles from the racecourse. Taxis can be laid on for travel between the Racecourse

and the Aerodrome. For information about helicopter services, please contact the Racecourse on 01243 755030. For all other landing facilities and permissions at Goodwood contact Goodwood Aerodrome on 01243 755061. Gatwick (1hr 10mins by road) and Heathrow (2hrs) offer both domestic and international flight services.
